MANAGEMENT REVIEW TEAM (MRT) MEMBER Job Description

Function

Even with the most extensive review by department, agency and NRP staff, proposed Neighborhood Action Plans and Early Access requests need a final review by senior managers from the participating jurisdictions (City, County, Libraries, Parks and Schools) and neighborhood representatives. The focus of the Management Review Team (MRT) is to coordinate staff involvement and ensure that the plan moves through the review, approval and implementation process effectively and efficiently. The MRT is a committee established by the NRP Policy Board.

The Management Review Team focuses on five areas:

- 1. Ensuring that an appropriate legal review has been conducted prior to making any recommendation for plan adoption by the Policy Board.
- **2.** Identifying and involving the department/agency/jurisdictional staff who should conduct the final review of the proposed plan and form an implementation team.
- **3.** Identifying areas of the plan that need clarification, enhancement, additional information or explanation before making a recommendation to the Policy Board.
- **4.** Coordinating communications among the jurisdictions to ensure plan conformance with existing jurisdictional policies and goals.
- **5.** Developing a work plan for budgeting and implementation of the plans with regular reports to the Policy Board.

Membership

The NRP Management Review Team is chaired by the City Coordinator and is composed of neighborhood representatives and senior managers of the participating jurisdictions. The following individuals are represented on the MRT:

- Executive Director, MCDA
- Director, Minneapolis Public Works Dept.
- Director, Minneapolis Planning Dept.
- Chief, Minneapolis Police Dept.
- Minneapolis City Attorney
- Director, NRP
- Representative of current NRP Policy Board Chair
- Two Representatives from Hennepin County
- Representative from Minneapolis Public Schools
- Representative from Minneapolis Park & Recreation Board
- Representative from Minneapolis Public Library
- Four Neighborhood Representatives/Four Neighborhood Alternates who are eligible to replace Neighborhood Representatives who cannot attend a meeting.

Other Important Information

- One representative and one alternate will be selected from each of the three neighborhood types; protection, redirection and revitalization. One representative and one alternate will be selected at-large.
- The NRP Policy Board Neighborhood Representatives will select MRT Neighborhood Representatives and Alternates through an open appointment process. Selections will be made in late March 2002. New members will begin their appointment to the MRT in April 2002 and serve until their successor is appointed in early 2003.
- The Management Review Team meets once a month. Each MRT member is mailed an information packet to review before each MRT meeting.
- MRT meetings are held from 4:30-6:30 p.m. in Room 333 at Minneapolis City Hall, 350 South 5th Street.
