## Hennepin County Household Hazardous Waste Site Criteria

Prior to site selection, Hennepin County must inspect and assess each potential location. The following are characteristics that are necessary for an HHW site. The events will take place outdoors.

Public property Impervious surface Flat or very little slope Size must accommodate a minimum of two 30-foot box trucks 300 feet of queuing space for approximately 15 participant vehicles (off-street or on-street, depending on specific site and permissions that may be granted) Parking space for several contractor staff High power lines to allow for commercial trucks (minimum 20-foot clearance) Must be located greater than 150 feet from a water supply well Must be used exclusively for the HHW collection on a specific day and during a specific time period Operational work areas will have controlled or restricted access to the general public Minimal impact on traffic in the surrounding area Minimal impact on the neighbors in the surrounding area Separate entrance and exit, to avoid congestion that may be caused by participants using the same entrance/exit Access for emergency vehicles Not blocking a fire hydrant Traffic flow for the event should follow the normal traffic flow (e.g., the direction on a one-way street would remain the same) Not immediately off a busy intersection or street

The expected participation, property size, types of waste collected, days of the week, and the hours have an effect on:

Layout of the work area Queuing of participants (including the number of lanes)

Number of staff

Number of work vehicles

Time on site to set up, collect HHW, and cleanup

Extra tasks that may be required

The time frame/lead time to plan
