## City of Minneapolis the Real Winner at NRP Awards Dinner

More than 400 Minneapolis residents attending the NRP Awards Dinner on February 24 enjoyed a night of celebration as 20 NRP initiatives from the program's first decade were honored with NRP Awards. The winning projects include:

**Best Housing Program:** HOMS Initiative, Jordan Home Improvement Program, and Logan Park Problem Properties Program.

Best Economic Development Project: Nicollet Avenue Streetscape: Eat Street.

**Best Human Services Program:** Glenwood/Lyndale Community Clinic, and Youth Farm and Market Project.

**Best Single Site Renovation:** D.B. Lyon House located at 419 Oak Grove St. in the Loring Park neighborhood.

Most Innovative Housing Project (large scale): East Village Mixed-Income, Mixed-Use Rental/Commercial Development on 11th Ave. S. near Elliot Park.

Most Innovative Housing Project (small scale): Artists on Chicago a IO-unit scattered site housing project for artists in the Powderhorn Park and Central neighborhoods.

**Best Environmental Project:** Lake Nokomis and Lake Hiawatha Improvement Project, and the Green Institute.

**Best Transportation Plan:** Neighbors for Safe Driving Campaign in the Fulton and Lynnhurst neighborhoods.

**Best Schools Project:** Cityview Community School, 3350 4th St. N., and Pratt School Renovation, 66 Malcolm SE.

Best Library Project: Hosmer Library, 347 E. 36th St.

# Rainville Sr. Wins Prestigious NRP Chairperson's Award

On a historic night where more than 400 Minneapolis residents gathered to celebrate a decade of NRP achievements, Michael Rainville Sr. was awarded the Prestigious Chairperson's Award for his commitment to making his neighborhood and city a better place to live, work, learn, and play.

The award was given to Rainville Sr. by Hennepin County Commissioner and NRP Policy Board Chair Mark Stenglein.

Rainville Sr. has served as the Chair of the St. Anthony West Neighborhood Organization since 1986. He has utilized the NRP to create innovative improvements to his neighborhood such as the annual "cops on bike" program in cooperation with St. Anthony East and the Nicollet Island East Bank neighborhoods, the NE Housing Resource Center in cooperation with the Greater Metropolitan Minneapolis Housing Corporation and the formation of the Mississippi Eastside Neighborhood Development Corp. (MEND) a partnership of the Bottineau, Sheridan and St. Anthony West neighborhoods. In addition, Rainville Sr. has been instrumental in shaping a strategic development plan that covers all of Northeast Minneapolis.
