NRP Phase II kickoff a success

Minneapolis residents showed how proud they are of their neighborhoods and city by attending the NRP Neighborhoods Conference on Saturday, February 24, 2001 at the Minneapolis Convention Center. More than 400 neighborhood and city leaders spent the day participating in 27 workshops before heading to the Minneapolis Regal Hotel for the NRP Awards Dinner and a late night dance. The Conference provided an opportunity for neighborhood activists involved in the NRP to celebrate their successes and receive inspiration to accomplish even greater things in Phase II of the NRP.

Most participants said they came to the conference in order to attend the numerous workshops. According to a survey that was returned by I2O conference participants, the most popular and well received workshops included "The Changing Face of Minneapolis," "What is Phase II," "The Neighborhood, the Arts and the NRP," "Reviewing Your NRP Phase I Plan," "Working with the City and Jurisdictions on NRP Projects," and "Putting the Action into Your Plan." Neighborhood Pride and networking opportunities were also rated as important reasons for attending the event.

Keynote Speaker John McKnight, who spoke during breakfast, was very well received. Most participants also responded positively to the neighborhood exhibits on display on the second floor of the Convention Center.

Twenty awards were presented at the Awards Dinner for projects in 12 award categories. 63 projects were nominated overall. In addition, NRP Policy Board Chair and Hennepin County Commissioner Mark Stenglein presented Michael Rainville Sr. with the Prestigious Chairperson's Award for his neighborhood involvement and activism. Dozens of neighborhood volunteers were also recognized during the event for their individual contributions to their neighborhoods.

Humboldt Greenway construction set to begin April 19

Neighborhood residents are invited to celebrate the start of new housing construction along the Humboldt Greenway on Thursday, April 19 from 4:00-6:00 p.m. Hosted by the Minneapolis Community Development Agency (MCDA) and Hennepin County, the construction kickoff for the first phase of the housing development will take place at the Creek View Neighborhood Center, 5001 Irving Ave. N.

Following comments about the project by city and county officials at 4:00 p.m., residents can board the RiverCity Trolley for a guided tour of the Greenway to learn about the single-family and senior housing projects planned for the area. Refreshments will be served and developers will be on hand to answer questions.

The project involves an eight-block area of Humboldt Ave. between Victory Memorial Drive and 53rd Ave. N. It will feature a new parkway, improvements to Shingle Creek, landscaped medians, boulevards, new open space, a pedestrian mall and a variety of housing. Construction will take place in several phases with CountryHome Builders, Inc. as the lead developer for nearly 200 units of single- family homes and townhomes, and CommonBond Communities as the developer for senior housing. Special financing will be available for low- and moderate-income buyers.

The Humboldt Greenway project evolved over several years as a cooperative effort between several public and private entities, including the MCDA, Hennepin County, the City of Minneapolis, the Minneapolis Neighborhood Revitalization Program, the Lind-Bohanon, Shingle Creek and Webber-Camden neighborhood association, and many others. Schedule of topics for NRP Training Series 2001 now official

In response to numerous requests for customized, NRP-specific training, the NRP will once again host a unique training series catering toward the needs of neighborhood association board members and staff. The series, titled NRP Training Series 2001, begins Monday April 30, 2001 with a workshop titled "Preparing for your Audit."

All training series workshops will be presented by NRP staff and other seasoned neighborhood veterans, and will be held at the Crown Roller Mill, 105 Fifth Ave. S., Suite 200, in MCDA Conference Room #3. All weeknight sessions will take place from 6:30 - 8:30 p.m., and all Saturday sessions (June 23 and August 25) will take place from 8:30 - 11:30 a.m.

"The training series is a response to input from neighborhoods requesting more information about NRP itself," said NRP Training Coordinator Robert Thompson. "Due to considerable board and staff turn-over, many neighborhoods lose touch with their history of involvement with the NRP. This series will help reintroduce neighborhoods to the purpose and workings of the NRP."

Other topics scheduled to be covered during this series of weeknight and Saturday workshops include: contract management; financial record keeping; audits and reporting; modifying your action plan; evaluating Phase I activities; and preparing for Phase II of the NRP.

The NRP is seeking individuals and groups with experience in neighborhood work to facilitate some of the workshops. The schedule for the training series was developed after one-on-one meetings with neighborhood leaders, phone discussions, group meetings, a mail survey, and through feedback from the NRP's February 24, 2001 10-Year Anniversary Conference.

McKnight Photography Fellowship Program Deadline is April 19

Since 1982 the Minneapolis-based McKnight Foundation has awarded Fellowships to Minnesota artists who use photography as a primary means of creative, personal expression and whose work demonstrates excellence. The University of Minnesota Department of Art is the administrative host for the Photography Fellowship Program.Beginning in 2001, a criterion for eligibility for the Fellowships will be evidence of advanced, active engagement with the community of photographic artists over a period of at least five years. A combination of exhibitions, publications, teaching, lecturing, and other activities will be weighed in making this decision.

Five \$25,000 Fellowships are awarded each spring by a three-member panel. The reviewers are selected from the community of artists, educators, curators, and critics outside of Minnesota who are familiar with the broad spectrum of photographic practice and receptive to a range of sensibilities. Their decisions are based primarily on the quality of work submitted, a plan for use of Fellowship funds and a record of past artistic accomplishments are also considered.

The McKnight Fellowships intend to enable the creative lives of Minnesota photographers for a twelve-month period. Funds underwrite free exploration of new ideas in an artist's own work. The money may be used during the Fellowship year to secure time, to purchase materials or equipment, and to supplement related travel expenses. Applicants must be residents of Minnesota for a year prior to and during the Fellowship year. Recipients cannot attend school full time during the Fellowship year.

Besides the financial assistance, the program also provides an exhibition opportunity following the Fellowship year, a publication accompanying the exhibition, a chance to consult with one of the review panelists, and other opportunities to present work and interact with people interested in photographic art.
