F or the 15th consecutive year, the Minneapolis and Saint Paul Home Tour will present its "Weekend Celebration of City Living." This year, 60 Minneapolis and Saint Paul homes will be open Saturday, May 4 from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and Sunday, May 5 from 1:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m.

Over the years, the Home Tour has had a single focus – bringing charming homes, creative remodeling ideas, real people, friendly neighborhoods and big city excitement to thousands of visitors. The event promotes urban living,

The Northeast Minneapolis Arts Association (NEMAA) will be hosting Minneapolis' seventh annual Art-A-Whirl neighborhood arts festival during the weekend beginning Friday, May 17. Each year, more than 10,000 people visit some 300 artists' studios and enjoy a variety of arts-focused family events taking place all over Northeast Minneapolis.

From Logan Park to old St. Anthony, from Marshall Street to Stinson Boulevard and all points in between, artists and galleries throw open their doors and invite the public to see their art. Art-A-Whirl presents the perfect opportunity for metro area residents to see why Northeast's spacious and sunny converted warehouses have fast become a haven for artists and their businesses over the last decade. A thriving community both financially and socially, Northeast Minneapolis has something for everyone.

### Linden Hills Community Library Grand Reopening to be held May 18

A festive grand reopening celebration of the renovated Linden Hills Community Library will take place on Saturday, May 18, from 1:00 to 6:00 p.m. Renovation of the 70-year-old library has resulted in additional public service space in the building. A ribbon-cutting ceremony at 1:00 p.m. will kick off the grand opening festivities followed by a short program in which a new art glass window will be unveiled and a time capsule filled. There will be activities for the whole family including music on the terrace, storytelling and a chance to "step into the past" with a nostalgic look at local history. Architects from Leonard Parker Associates and glass artist Phil Daniel will be on hand to discuss the library's new features. The Linden Hills Library project was funded through the city's Capital Improvement Program, supplemented by \$138,000 of Linden Hills NRP funds and a State Accessibility Grant. The library has the distinction of being completed ahead of the "Great Libraries for Minneapolis" program, made possible by Minneapolis taxpayers who are funding the new Central Library and a decade of community library improvements. By 2010, the program will bring all 14 community libraries into the 21st century by "building new, restoring old, improving all."

Art-A-Whirl embodies the spirit of this dynamic community. Visitors to Art-A-Whirl can either explore the art on their own or they can catch one of the many free shuttle buses that take people on guided tours.

All Art-A-Whirl events are free, family friendly and open to the public. #### Minneapolis names 11 Building Blocks Award winners

Good block clubs come in all shapes and sizes – at least that's the way things turned out with the fourth annual Minneapolis Building Blocks Awards. This year's award winners include traditional block clubs, block club networks, a business watch group that spans II avenues and 120 businesses and an apartment block club that includes a complex of four apartment buildings. Block clubs are the cornerstone of a strong, vital community. Each year the Building Blocks Awards are given to block clubs that build a sense of community, share leadership, take initiative in problem solving and work cooperatively with the Minneapolis Police Department. The awards are designed to confer much-deserved honor on successful block clubs and to stimulate interest in creating new block clubs where there are none or even to revitalize older, less active ones. Building Blocks Awards are a program of Community Crime Prevention/SAFE (CCP/SAFE), a unit of the Minneapolis Police Department. Nominations for the awards come from community members and CCP/SAFE staff. A CCP/SAFE staff committee selected the winners. A consortium of South Minneapolis neighborhoods is requesting proposals for a consultant to coordinate the 2003 South Minneapolis Home Improvement Fair. The coordinator will report to a neighborhood advisory committee and serve as the organizer and lead contact for this event.

The South Minneapolis Home Improvement Fair is an annual event in its ninth year. It takes place in March and draws nearly 100 exhibitors and as many as 3,000 visitors.

The coordinator oversees all planning and implementation tasks of the South Minneapolis Home Improvement Fair including: preparing agendas and chairing Advisory Committee meetings, preparing a timeline for planning tasks, coordinating publicity for the event, preparing all written registration materials, receiving and processing all mail and phone registrations, maintaining a data base of registrants and participants, coordinating volunteers, coordinating and preparing a contractor booklet for the event, maintaining expense and income reports for the Advisory Committee, coordinating additional fundraising as needed and tabulating evaluation sheets and preparing a final report following the event.

The South Minneapolis Home Improvement Fair coordinator operates as a sole proprietor and is responsible for his/her own health and liability insurance. Compensation is \$6,000 - \$8,000 depending on experience with additional incentives possible based on performance.
