Four neighborhood representatives elected to serve on NRP Policy Board

More than 120 Minneapolis residents attended the NRP Policy Board neighborhood representative election on Thursday, November 20. Sixty-seven electors, chosen by their neighborhood boards, elected four neighborhood representatives to serve on the 2004 NRP Policy Board.

Those elected include: Debbie Evans as the at-large representative, Cam Gordon as the revitalization neighborhood representative, Nicholas T. Kakos as the protection neighborhood representative and Zachary Korb as the redirection neighborhood representative. Steven A. Miller, Carol Ann Pass, Jeffrey L. Strand and Sean Wherly were elected as Policy Board alternates. Both Kakos and Gordon won re-election. Evans and Korb currently sit on the board as neighborhood representative alternates. The 19-member Policy Board provides overall direction to the program and is primarily responsible for the review and approval of Neighborhood Action Plans. The NRP Policy Board election is held annually in November to fill four neighborhood resident seats on the board. One candidate is elected to represent each of the three types of NRP neighborhoods: redirection, revitalization and protection. An at-large representative is also elected. Neighborhood representatives serve one-year terms beginning in January.

NRP-TV to present two-part progress report on Affordable Housing Reserve Fund projects

Throughout December, the Minneapolis Neighborhood News (MNN) cable television program will present part one of a two-part series focusing on the progress of the first projects funded through the NRP Affordable Housing Reserve Fund. The fund was established by the NRP Policy Board to demonstrate the program's commitment to providing long-term affordable housing for individuals and families that earn less than half of the Metro Median Income. Last year, nearly \$4 million from the fund was invested in seven projects that will create or renovate 195 units of affordable housing. Combined, the projects will leverage an additional \$33 million in private and public financing and will include the production of another 104 market-rate units.

Part one of the NRP affordable housing series will feature a groundbreaking celebration for the 28-unit East Phillips Commons near Lake Street and Bloomington Avenue South, the 36-unit Lofts on Arts Avenue project in the Stevens Square neighborhood and the grand opening of a 21-unit expansion to the Jeremiah Program's residential facility in the Loring

Park neighborhood. Tune in and listen to future Lofts on Arts Avenue resident John Fiorella describe his excitement at finding an affordable ownership opportunity so close to downtown.
